#### Phil Fass on Color Theory




Color theory: from perceptual models to the hybridizer's task



While often considered the domain of designers, artists and color industry professionals, understanding color theory basics can help inform the viewer's response to a given item or artifact. Are there aspects of color theory that can inform the act of daylily hybridizing, or does the genetic co-dominance seen in the majority of crosses place the hybridizer in a position of merely responding to the result?

Our Banquet was held at the Marriot. This year, we had a silent auction, live auction, photo contest, and of course, a wonderful meal.



## Plant Adoption

Every year, lucky applicants get to choose from great plants to "adopt" for a couple of years and grow on for the Club Auction. Next year, it could be you!

Our Plant Adoption Program is a reward for volunteering for the Club during the year, so if you helped at any activities this year or were on the Board or a committee for us, PLEASE APPLY! (see eligibility requirements below). You get to choose and raise a newer cultivar (sometimes the current year introductions!) for 2-3 years and give the increase back to the Club for the Auction. You get to keep the original number of fans (up to 2) that you received, and the Club gets the proceeds at the Auction---it's a WIN-WIN situation for all! We are hoping for big, fat, healthy fans to sell, so please take the very best care you can of the babies!

The Board has voted to continue this program again for next year, so I hope everyone who is eligible will submit an application to adopt a daylily! Application forms are included in this newsletter and are due by our fall meeting on

October 27, 2025.

### Eligibility

- ·Be a member of DSM for 1 or more years.
- ·Be current in club dues.
- ·Attend any two of our annual events (Fall or Winter regular meetings, Dig &/or Sale, summer tour, Show, Banquet/Auction, or any Regional meeting that we host).
- ·Assist at one of the above events or miscellaneous help such as Plant Fairs, special club projects, serving on the Board or committees, hosting garden tours, helping at a Regional that we host etc., or donate plants to Plant Sale or Auction.
- ·Must submit application form.
- ·Must sign and be willing to follow the contract (copies available upon request).

All members in a household that qualify are eligible to adopt!

### Contract

- ·DSM retains ownership of the plants and will ask for annual updates of their progress, and to be notified if the plant expires;
- the member agrees to care for the plant to the best of their ability—adequate watering, fertilizing, weeding, no dividing of the plant and no seed pods allowed to form to promote the best growth;
- ·if the member is not able to continue growing the plant, or is not a paid member of DSM, they will return the plant; and,
- •the member will dig the plant for the auction as directed, retaining the number of fans originally received—but not to exceed 2 fans.
